Our Bunnings Sausage Sizzle is coming up in August – please let our P&C know ASAP if you are able to help us out!

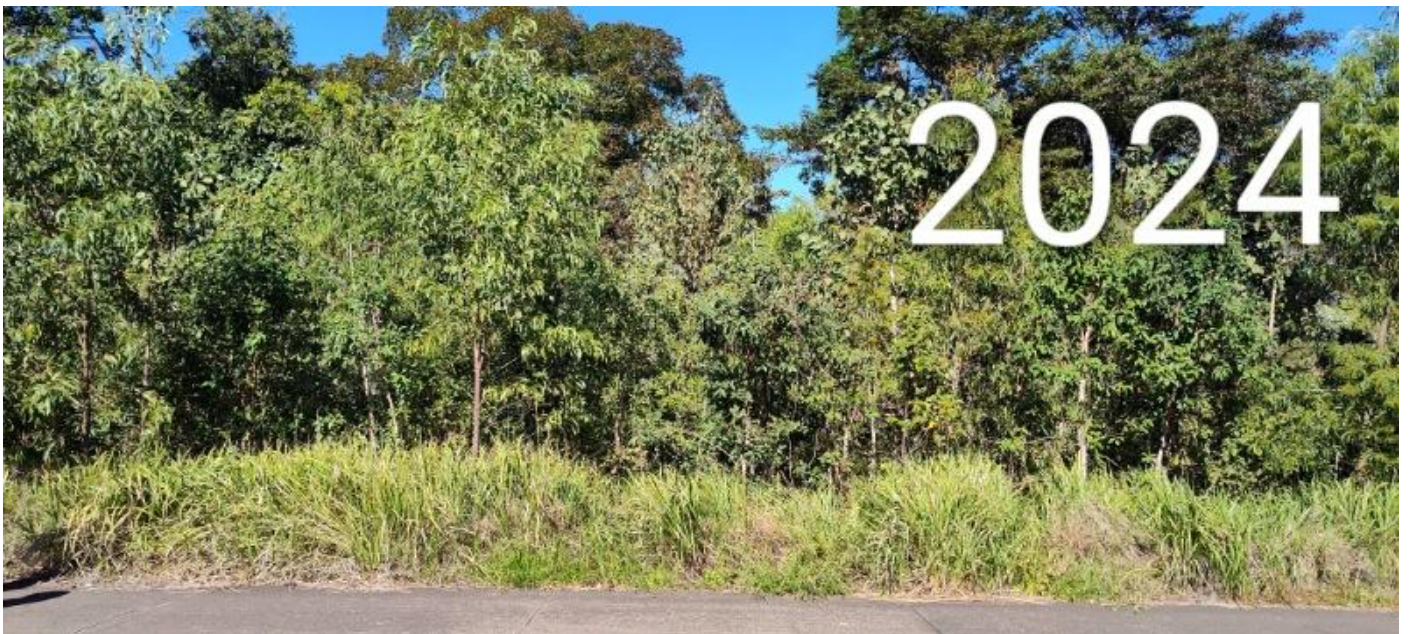
Curriculum Newsletter

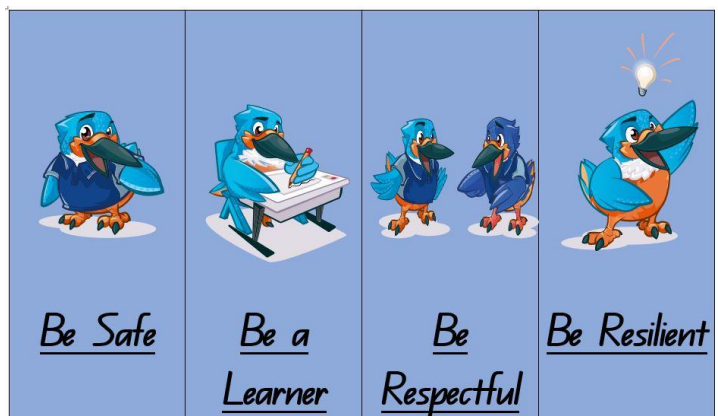
